## Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Welcome to the East Hamersley Primary School community. The 2017 school year promises to be challenging and very rewarding to you as parents of children entering the Kindergarten programme. Every effort will be made to ensure that all students will receive the very best introduction to school life.

We as a school staff have ensured that a comprehensive programme will operate for Kindergarten children. We focus on the foundations of literacy and numeracy and to meet their developmental needs through age appropriate activities. There are five key principles that we believe form the basis of successful development in children's understandings. These are:

- Play and exploration are essential for effective early learning.
- Children develop and learn at different rates and in different ways.
- Children's learning is integrated and related to their development.
- A child's attitude and feelings towards learning are developed in their early years.
- Judgements about children's educational progress and achievement are based on regular observations in a variety of situations and settings, using a variety of information sources, over time.

The kindergarten year of school is very special. This is a time for children to learn that school is a fun and safe place to be. It's also a great time for parents and caregivers to meet each other and become part of the school community. The Kindergarten staff are looking forward to working closely with you and your children as they grow and learn through our play based programme.

I look forward to developing strong partnerships with parents and students.

# Welcome to East Hamersley Kindergarten

## KINDERGARTEN PARENT INFORMATION 2017

Your child's time at Kindergarten establishes a strong foundation for the development of the whole child. The Kindergarten program provides experiences to develop physical, social, emotional and cognitive growth. The program is designed to cater for each individual child, encouraging a natural progression through developmental learning, enhanced by stimulating and fun learning experiences.

The Kindergarten program operates every Tuesday and Thursday, and every second Friday (even weeks) throughout the school terms.

## WHAT YOU NEED FOR KINDERGARTEN

- One piece of fruit, vegetable, dried fruit or rice crackers to share every day.
- A large bag, that they can open and close themselves;
- A broad-brimmed hat; (The school has a “No Hat, No Play in the Sun” policy. Please label hats with your child’s name and keep it in your child’s school bag.);
- A change of clothes, just in case;
- Joggers or sandals with a grip sole to climb with. Velcro fasteners are easy; (Students need to be able to tie their own laces if wearing shoes with laces)
- Named drink bottle;
- Lunch when attending full days. (healthy food is encouraged)

## **Student Information Sheet**

An information sheet has been attached for parents to fill out and return to the Kindergarten teacher. This is to help the teacher learn a little about the children before they start Kindy and to plan a program that caters to their needs.

## **Parent Teacher Meetings**

You are invited to attend individual parent meetings to meet the teacher and for friendly discussions. These are held in Term 2, but you are also encouraged to see the teacher for a meeting anytime, if you have a concern.

## **Communication**

Partnerships between school and home are essential to help build a positive learning environment for your child. Parents and teachers working together ensure the development of learning outcomes for your child. Communication between parents and teachers is always valuable, particularly for the exchange of information that can help us understand your child. If at any time of the year you have any questions regarding your child's education, please feel free to contact us. If you would like to come to the Early Childhood Centre to discuss your child's progress, please be aware that this cannot happen whilst teaching is in progress but you are welcome to make an appointment.

## **Attendance**

It is essential for your child to attend Kindergarten to establish regular attendance at school. It is vital that if your child has any problems settling into the Kindy routine that you discuss this with your child's teacher. We want to make your child's start to formal education a special one. If your child is away you must provide a note with a reasonable excuse for not attending.

## **Sick Children**

Children who are unwell are best kept away from school. Kindergarten does not have a sick room or a quiet corner. The room is always a hive of activity and constructive noise. Should your child become sick or have an injury we will phone you.

## **Addresses, phone numbers and emergency contacts**

Please ensure that we always have your **up to date** contact details.

## **Sign In**

Please sign in at the office if you are visiting the school or collecting a child during school hours. This register is for health and security reasons. Thank you.

## **Birthdays**

When a child has a birthday, you are welcome to bring small cakes to school to share.



## **Toys**

Please do not send toys to school; this will avoid arguments, loss and breakages. We do have a News Bag system which enables all children to bring in special items to share with the class. Each child will have a turn of the News Bag each term.

## Parent Participation

This will be offered to you in many forms:

- Parents and family will be invited to help in the Kindergarten. Please place your name on the roster. Your help is greatly appreciated.
- A Laundry roster is also available on a weekly basis.
- During Special Days when you will be invited to join us.
- As a resource person collecting cardboard boxes, cylinders, wool bits, dress-ups and other valuable junk material for us.
- Fundraising will be ongoing throughout the year combining school, P & C and separate Kindergarten fundraising activities.

- Strengthens the bond between school and home.

## School Contributions

## HOW TO HELP YOUR CHILD BEGIN KINDERGARTEN

Here are some easy ways you can help your child. It takes time but it's worth it.

- Provide some experiences where your child is accustomed to spending a little time away from you, knowing that you will return.
- Encourage your child to independently use a toilet and wash and dry hands
- Encourage your child to be able to open and close their lunchbox and school bag
- Encourage your child to be able to put on their shoes and socks.
- Encourage your child to wipe their own nose.
