Our Kindergarten Program

Is it our intention that the best opportunities are offered to your child to challenge and extend their learning, allowing your child to reach their full potential. Our goal, at all stages, is to provide the necessary ingredients for success and the laying of foundations for successful practices and knowledge for the future. These goals include the following:

- Development of a positive self esteem and understanding of themselves.
- Encouragement to participate as members of a group, learning to share and take turns.
- Development of the ability to work independently.
- Providing opportunities to initiate and interact positively with peers and adults.
- Our program is progressive in that we are delivering evidence based practices that enhance children's growth and development.
- The content of the program will be developed from the children's own needs and interest as well as aligned to both the WA K- 10 Curriculum and the Early Years Learning Framework for Australia (EYLF). Reports will be sent home twice during the school year.

We strongly believe that children need to be given the opportunity to see what they are capable of learning. Just watch them learn!

Parent and Carers as Partners in Education

Parent and carer involvement in school contributes to improved student learning, health and wellbeing. The engagement and involvement of parents/carers at East Hamersley school is embedded in the school culture. This involvement is strongly related to improved student learning, attendance and behaviour. These parent and carer partnerships are collaborative, based on effective communication, mutual trust and respect and shared responsibility for the education of the students at the school. Parents/ carers have a visible presence in the school and their contributions are valued by our staff. Parents/carers routinely promote the school and celebrate its achievements in the wider community.



The Kindergarten Day

Kindergarten is a wonderland of painting and story time; of talking and listening; of exploring the world; and of making new friends.



Your child begins to build on what they have learned at home. This includes their understanding of language - that language is made up of words, that written words are made up of letters in the alphabet and that spoken sounds can be written down. They also learn about numbers and shapes and the many different ways we use maths in our lives everyday.

These early lessons are precursors to helping your child later with reading, spelling, language and mathematic skills. Yours child's teacher takes into account the many different experiences and backgrounds of the children in the classroom to make sure the learning program helps each child.

Children learn social skills by playing with other children and sharing equipment. Play allows your child to share and take turns while developing confidence in social settings. Not all children have this ability naturally so it is here at Kindy where we give the children opportunities and the structure for success.

All of the above is vital to their future formal learning. While Kindergarten is pre-compulsory education, parents are encouraged to send their children to give them the opportunity of actively engaging in both the curriculum and becoming an important part of the school community. The skills they learn give them the start they need to embark on their educational journey.



What to send

- Booklist requirements are to be sent in on your child's first day at Kindergarten. Label the bag that contains all the booklist requirements.
- Recess food. For example, sultanas, a piece of fruit, cheese, capsicum, tomatoes, cucumber, apricots and rice crackers
- A healthy lunch for them packed in a lunch box
- Water in a drink bottle, preferably with a push down spout.
- A bucket or broad brimmed hat is required from Week 1.
- A change of clothes should be kept in your child's bag, in case of accidents.
- Consumable items such as pencils, only need to be labelled on the box as these will be shared.



Arrival and departure of children

The doors open at 8:45am for a start time of 8:50am. Please bring your child to the front door in the mornings. It is best that you arrive as close as possible to 8:45am. The school day ends at 3pm.

If you arrive late, or wish to take your child out of school during the school day, you must <u>first</u> come to the admin office to sign them in or out using the ipad. Please always list a reason for the lateness or absence. You will be given a blue LATE or green LEAVE pass to give to the teacher.

If you wish your child to be collected by someone other than yourself, please add their details to the Pick-Up Permission form. We will not release any child to another adult without written permission. If you wish for your child to be picked up by a brother or a sister attending this school please discuss this arrangement with the Principal.

To avoid your child becoming distressed, please ensure punctual pick up times. You are requested to remain outside of the classroom when collecting your child. This will assist the teacher when dismissing the children.
